Background info:

Jude Law's character asks to be called by his middle name, Eugene. "Eugene" comes from the Greek for "well born," which he is. "Eugenics" is the "applied science or the bio-social movement which advocates the use of practices aimed at improving the genetic composition of a population", usually referring to the manipulation of human populations. It has become associated with Nazi abuses, such as enforced "racial hygiene", human experimentation, and the extermination of "undesired" population groups.

Genism, or genoism, is the theory that distinctive human characteristics and capacities are determined by genes. Genism may also refer to any and all discrimination based on the genotype of a person rather than their individual merits.

The word "Gattaca" is composed entirely of the letters used to label the nucleotide bases of DNA (guanine, adenine, thymine, and cytosine). During the opening and closing credits, the letters G, A, T, and C are all highlighted.

The film was shot under the title "The Eighth Day." This was a reference to the Biblical creation story, which states that the earth was created in six days and on the seventh day, God rested. The original title implies the tampering of man with what God has already made.

The icons used to denote a Valid versus an In-Valid have significant meaning. On the scanners, an infinity symbol appears next a Valid's name, denoting their "infinite potential." Next to an In-Valid's name, a dagger appears. In biology, a dagger next to a taxon (organism or species) indicates extinction. In addition, the dagger symbol resembles a cross, a reference to In-Valids being referred to as "God Children."

Public address announcements in the Gattaca Corporation headquarters building are in Esperanto, an artificial language invented in the 19th century.

The winding stairs in Jerome's apartment have a helical structure, like DNA.

Movie Nights for Thinkers and Seekers

Giovanni Domenico Cassini, a 17th century Italian astronomer, discovered Saturn's "Great Red Spot," the prominent gap in Saturn's main rings, and 4 of its moons. The main female character's name is Cassini. The space mission in Gattaca is destined for Saturn. In 1997, NASA launched the Cassini space probe bound for Saturn, with an expected impact in 2017. Cassini's son, grandson, and great-grandson went on to also become notable astronomers! His great-great-grandson broke this tradition, but nevertheless became a notable botanist.

The FBI agents are called "*Hoovers,*" a reference to the longest-serving director of the FBI, J. Edgar Hoover, but also a clever reference to a vacuum cleaner brand. There are numerous shots of vacuums being used to gather DNA evidence.

New Zealand writer-director Andrew Niccol also wrote the script for "The Truman Show."

Discussion points:

- 1. Where does our society stand on various forms of discrimination? Discuss this quote from the movie: "We now have discrimination down to a science."
- 2. One movie tagline says, "There is no gene for the human spirit." Talents, gifts, abilities, and genes are God's gift to us. What we do with them is our gift to God. Discuss.
- 3. What does the naming of the brothers say about the value in the father's eyes of each of his sons?
- 4. The human condition could be described as de-gene-eration. No matter how much our physical bodies are improved, we need more than genetic engineering to cure our human condition we need a Savior. Discuss what Jesus Christ did for us in re-gene-eration.
- 5. Faith has been defined as r-i-s-k . . . can we see places in our lives where we have "saved for the swim back" instead of being willing to go all out for the glory of God?
- 6. What can we learn from the predictions made about Vincent's life when he was born? What kinds of predictions have you experienced? How do predictions such as these relate to the sovereignty of God? the free will of man?
- 7. In what ways does our society discriminate against people who are "less than?" How can we "act justly" and "love mercy" and "walk humbly with our God" (Micah 6:8)?
