Background info:

- Carl T. Hayden Community High School is located in Phoenix, Arizona. It is named after a U.S. Representative and Senator who represented Arizona for 57 years, from 1912 to 1969.
- The film's tagline is "It takes a team to build a dream."
- This film is based on the Wired Magazine article "La Vida Robot" by Joshua Davis, about the true story of a group of students from a mainly Latino high school who competed in the 2004 Marine Advanced Technology Education ROV (Remotely Operated Vehicle) competition. It was also inspired by the book, "Spare Parts: Four Undocumented Teenagers, One Ugly Robot, and the Battle for the American Dream" by Joshua Davis.
- Filming was done in New Mexico.

- 6. Share something that a mentor modeled or taught you that has helped you in your life.
- 7. What did you notice about teamwork demonstrated in this film?
- 8. What are the pros and cons of competitions that stand out the most to you?
